## A Note from the Director

Dear STS Alumni,

Usually summer is the slow season here on campus. But not this year, or at least, not in STS. We've been as busy as heck here in Building 200 and I wanted to write and let you know some of the things we've been up to.

First and foremost, we've been managing growth. We have well over 200 majors and are now the fourth largest undergraduate major at Stanford. Our faculty have responded by creating a raft of new courses. With funding from the Vice Provost for Undergraduate Education, Professors Paula Findlen from History, Sandra Soo-Jin Lee from the Medical School, and Dan McFarland from the School of Education will offer a collaborative introductory lecture course to prospective and new majors. At the other end of the curriculum, we have a whole new series of small senior capstone courses. To take just two as examples: Walter W. Powell will teach a course on the sociology of innovation – a field that his research has defined for two decades. Elaine Trehame, one of the world's leading medievalists, will teach a one-of-a-kind course on texts as technologies – a course in which students will get hands on exposure to medieval manuscripts and use them to think about the design of interfaces, then and now. Our Associate Director, Dr. Kyoko Sato, will continue to offer courses on the politics of technology as well. At this moment, she is in Fukushima, Japan, on a National Science Foundation grant, researching the consequences of the nuclear meltdowns there.

Our extraordinary staff and our highly committed peer advisors have worked tirelessly to keep our majors engaged with one another and the faculty. As you scan down this email, you'll see some of the flagship events they've created. My personal favorite was the alumni dinner. It was really exciting to watch our students and our alumni recognize how much they had in common.

We hope you'll stay involved with the program yourself, in whatever capacity you can. STS is a major and a discipline, but at Stanford, we're also a community. And a growing one too.

Here's wishing you a bit of end-of-summer peace.
