A Note from the New STS Director

Hello STS Alums:

I'd like to introduce myself, as I'm the new STS Director starting September 1, 2014 and running for the next three years. But first, I'd like to join everyone in expressing our thanks to the marvelous job that Fred Turner has done in directing the Program in Science, Technology, and Society over the last three years, following on Robert McGinn's excellent leadership prior to that. It is worth noting that where Robert comes from the Department of Management Science and Engineering and Fred from the Department of Communications, I hail from the Graduate School of Education. This attests to the interdisciplinary nature of the STS program, which operates at the intersection of multiple interests.

My field of Education is itself an amalgam of disciplines. My own work is in the history of ideas that have an impact on learning – with studies on European imperialism, the role of dictionaries, and intellectual property – and in the sociology of knowledge, concerned with what is taught in schools, but also beyond the schools through *Wikipedia* and other *open* approaches to learning. In addition, there's an "activist" engineering side to my work involving the design and development of open source (free) software helping thousands of scholarly journals make their research more widely available, with many now offering "open access" to their content.

But enough about me – how about the STS program this year? Among new developments, we have taken on more of a global focus, under the leadership of the program's Associate Director Kyoko Sato, with courses that add that broader perspective and sense of responsibility. These global courses include World Food Economy, Science and Law in History, and Urban Culture in a Global Perspective. We are gearing up, as well, for the continuing growth of STS, which reached 300 majors last year. It is fortunate that the program has such a strong staff and faculty participation from across the campus.

I am looking to taking on this new role in STS for the coming year. Do feel free to introduce yourself and say hello. I appreciate this opportunity of working with the STS community, and welcome your continuing involvement in it.
